Brews, Boats & Barbeque

With three new craft breweries, Muskegon County is rapidly becoming a craft brew lover's paradise!

Day 1

1 hour – Begin your day with a tour of the **USS LST 393 Veterans Museum**. History jumps out at you from every deck and corner. This veteran of Omaha Beach earned three battle stars in World War II and is one of only two Landing Ship Tanks that remain in the United States.

1 hour – On your way to Pere Marquette Beach, visit the Lakeside Area of Muskegon County and take a tour of the **S.S. Milwaukee Clipper**, Muskegon's original ferry featuring art deco interiors, a soda fountain, ballroom and movie theater. Built in 1904, eight years before the Titanic, the Clipper traversed Lake Michigan from 1941 until 1970 carrying untold thousands of passengers and automobiles between Muskegon and Milwaukee! Don't miss your chance to tour "The Queen of the Great Lakes"!

1 hour – Enjoy a delicious lunch at Muskegon's new barbeque restaurant, **The**

Deck! They have all the B's...barbeque, beer and the beach! Be sure to dine outside and take in the panoramic view of gorgeous Lake Michigan and Pere Marquette Beach.

1 hour – Tour a restored WWII Submarine, a Prohibition Era Coast Guard Cutter and the wonderful exhibits at the **USS Silversides Submarine Museum!** Self-guided tours let you experience what it was really like to sail a sub trolling the waters of the South Pacific 60-plus years ago. Guests can walk the deck topside as well as the major internal compartments below deck. Tour passes also include access to the Coast Guard Cutter McLane, a rare Prohibition Era vessel from 1927 and the fully handicap accessible museum.

1 hour – Time to head to the new **Pigeon Hill Brewing Company**. The brand plays off the famed local sand dune, Pigeon Hill, which was the largest sand dune on the Lake Michigan shoreline before it was mined away. Their dream is to bring back the magic of the old Muskegon Brewing

Co., which opened in 1876 on Muskegon Lake. It produced what some considered the finest beers in the Midwest until Prohibition ended the fun.

1 hour – Next, let's walk right down the street to visit the new **Unruly Brewing Company!** Unruly is the first brewery to brew beer in Muskegon since 1957. They offer a wide range of craft beer styles as well as an outdoor beer garden, live music and free brewery tours anytime!

Day 2

2 hours – Head to the northern part of Muskegon County and discover the **White Lake Area**, a picturesque, small town with an artsy vibe. There are many unique shopping opportunities, all within walking distance in the downtown area. Whether you’re looking for antiques, original artwork, unique gifts, or an old fashioned soda fountain, shopping in White Lake will be a fun and relaxing experience. 1 hour – Enjoy lunch in White Lake! Remember the good ‘ole days of frosty mugs of real draft root beer and cooked-to-order food served at your car by a cheerful Carhop? 1/2 hour – Tour the **White River Gallery!** This gallery is a cooperative of over 20 Michigan artists, offering one-of-a-kind paintings, sculpture, glass, textiles, pottery and jewelry. www.artswhitelake.org

1-3 hours – Check out Muskegon’s newest brewery, **Fetch Brewing Company!** This 6,000 sq. ft. space has a full bar, two levels of table space, and a vault which has been transformed into a seating area which owner, Dan Hain, refers to as the “Penny Lounge”, as its floor is made entirely of pennies. They feature seven beers ranging from 3.5 to 6 percent. www.fetchbrewing.com

The new **“Boar’s Belly”** is a farm-to-table eatery with a full bar and 23 TV screens to enjoy your favorite sports!
